## CEV Autumn Volunteering Congress 25-26 October 2018 Brussels, Belgium

The European Volunteer Centre (CEV) held its Autumn volunteering congress welcoming over 100 participants from more than 50 organisations and 30 countries. Opportunities for debate on current trends in the volunteer sector & youth engagement through networking sessions between representatives of civil society organisations, municipalities, and EU institutions were provided. Keynote presentations were also contributed by Silvia Kalman (European Commission) and Lucas Meijs (Rotterdam School of Management Erasmus University).

The CEV Congress was supported by Europe for Citizens, ERASMUS+, the Danish Permanent Representation to the EU and the City of Aarhus (European Volunteering Capital 2018).
