




rate of volunteering 2016

Why is inequality in volunteering a problem?



underrepresented groups have fewer chances to shape society according to their interests

access is...

... not only a first step into volunteering

... to every new task and new position

... to defend one's position in a discussion



thresholds

- for everyone
- unnoticed by some, a major hurdle for others
- depend on social status
- not easy to eliminate
- arise in an unequal society



financial resources

→ volunteering requires financial resources



time autonomy

→ volunteering requires being available at specific times

racism, classism, and ableism

assumptions about typical volunteers

... and those who are not invited to volunteer



lack of representation

- → issues are devaluated as minority issues
- → volunteers think they are the only ones with specific experiences



ways of speaking

not all contributions are valued

→ keeping silent
