Recently a change in EU discourse can be noted in that the EU appears be increasingly concerned with encouraging people to volunteer in order to gain skills, and increase their employability. For example, the reference to the European Voluntary Service (EVS) in the EC Communication "Youth Opportunities Initiative" (2012) rather than recalling the intercultural and solidarity dimension of the programme states that:

"...such work experience in another Member State can provide important skills and help young people enter the labour market..."

Cross–Border Volunteering: What is it for?





Sarajevo is the capital and largest city of Bosnia and Herzegovina, capital of the Federation of Bosnia and Herzegovina entity and the centre of the Sarajevo Canton. Often referred to as the Jerusalem of Europe, Sarajevo is famous for its cultural and religious diversity, and centuries-long coexistence of adherents of Islam, Orthodoxy, Catholicism and Judaism. The city is the leading political, economic, social and cultural point of Bosnia and Herzegovina, and is repeatedly listed in travel guides as a one of the best cities in Europe to visit.
